

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

Wheeling Jesuit University

and

West Virginia Northern Community College.



This agreement guarantees the transferability of the graduation requirements from West Virginia Northern Community College to those listed on the attached Undergraduate Catalog for Wheeling Jesuit University. This agreement will be supplemented by specific program-to-program articulation agreements for major programs of study as listed in the attached Catalog. This guarantee is subject to the following recommendations and restrictions:

1. The attached Catalog will be honored by Wheeling Jesuit University for a period of two years from the date of printing as recorded on the Catalog. Students will be graduated under the Catalog in effect on this date unless 1) the student is given and accepts the opportunity to be placed under a more recent Catalog or 2) a change in the program is mandated by requirements of an external accrediting agency or other regulatory agency, including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Department of Education, ACBSP, CCNE, HLC, or TEAC. In the case of any changes resulting from new requirements of an external accrediting agency and/or other regulatory agency, the transfer student will be affected in the same manner as students native to Wheeling Jesuit University. The student should keep a copy of this Catalog for verification purposes.
2. Students having completed an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree from the West Virginia Northern Community College will be considered to have completed all of the requirements of the Core Curriculum of Wheeling Jesuit University with the exception of: 1) two 300 level courses: one in Philosophy and one in Theology (specified by the Faculty of the Philosophy at Wheeling Jesuit University); and 2) one


course in Ethics/Moral Theology (PHI 305 Ethics, 3 semester credit hours or RST 305 Christian Ethics, 3 semester credit hours).

3. Students will be required to attain the following to graduate from Wheeling Jesuit University:
 - a. Complete an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree at West Virginia Northern Community College;
 - b. Complete the three courses in the Core Curriculum as described in Section 2;
 - c. Complete the requirements in a major area of concentration either in total at Wheeling Jesuit University or in accordance with existing specific program-to-program articulation agreements between the West Virginia Northern Community College and Wheeling Jesuit University;
 - d. Complete a minimum of 60 hours with an adjusted grade point average of no less than 2.000 at Wheeling Jesuit University;
 - e. Complete at Wheeling Jesuit University not less than 18 credit hours required for the major (to be determined by the Chair of the major department);
 - f. Complete elective courses identified and selected in consultation with the student's assigned faculty advisor at Wheeling Jesuit University;
 - g. Satisfy all financial obligations to Wheeling Jesuit University;
 - h. Complete all assessment tests and interviews as may be required by the student's major at Wheeling Jesuit University; and
 - i. Submit an application for graduation within the prescribed time frame as published by the Registrar's Office at Wheeling Jesuit University.
4. Completion of an Associate's degree at West Virginia Northern Community College does not guarantee admission to Wheeling Jesuit University; students must be officially admitted according to the admission requirements as established by Wheeling Jesuit University.

5. This agreement shall be evaluated by both institutions every two years. Its continuation is contingent upon both institutions renewing the agreement.
6. Any attempt to modify, change, or alter any part of this agreement through electronic or other means would make this agreement null and void.


