Review of September's Minutes	<p>John Lantz motioned to approve September's minutes. Tasha Omelchenko-Comer seconded. Motion approved.</p> <p>Mr. Lantz stated that Robert's Rules have changed and motions to approve minutes are not necessary.</p> <p>Kathy Herrington introduced the new student representative, Shawn McElroy to the committee.</p>

Supplemental Courses	Ms. Kriechbaum discussed the issue of supplemental math courses. Each supplement is built specifically to support the core course. Result is that a student may need to complete more than one supplemental math course if they take multiple math courses. However, currently if a student takes one supplemental math course they are waived from taking others. More discussion needs to occur on how to correct this.	A plan will need developed moving forward to address this issue.
Potential Implications of New Testing Policy	Dr. Loveless explained the new testing policy being worked on. It is a multiple measure placement process. Ms. Yesenczki mentioned that there was concern from some faculty that this could potentially negate course pre-requisites. Dr. Loveless explained that it would only negate supplemental course co/prerequisites.	
Other Business	Ms. Yesenczki informed the committee that the program directors for HIT and MAS were working on a CAS degree that would feed into the second year of both programs. Mock HLC interviews will be conducted at November's meeting. Ms. Herrington asked if proposals that were not completed in the previous year could be archived so they no longer appear in the list of active proposals. Ms. Yesenczki will check on this.
